The tuberculosis clinic with its bare chest examinations, is of first and last importance in combating consumption. Through the clinic doubtful cases are diagnosed early enough to prevent the successful treatment of the disease, and convalescent patients are guarded against the danger of a hidden relapse.

In the follow-up correspondence which the Michigan Tuberculosis Association now carries on with all patients discharged from the State Tuberculosis Sanatorium, the convalescents are reminded at the end of three months that they should return to the sanatorium for examination.
