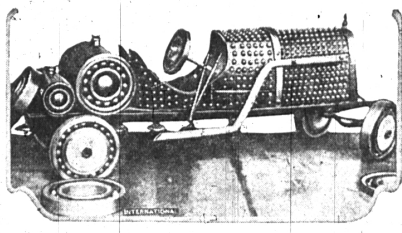
Prohibition enforcement officers at Jacksonville, Fla., recently seized a large shipment of coconuts and found that each nut was filled with strong "moon liquor."

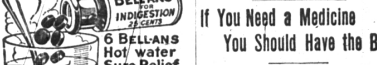

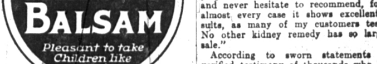
