THE SPECIAL ELECTION

The Village of Birmingham is owned entirely by the stockholders. Every eligible voter has the right to say just how his or her town shall be conducted. It is desired, however, that the majority of opinions on any certain subject shall be the will of the entire population. And the only way that such decisions are arrived at is by the holding of an election.

On next Wednesday, January 11, the people of Birmingham will go to the polls in answer to a call from the Village Commission. Chief of these propositions are the two relating to the extension of our inadequate water works system.

One of them is set forth by the Village Commission, the other by the Citizens' Water Commission. For either one of them to win there must be at least sixty percent of the total votes cast in its favor. Anything less than this proportion will make the entire balloting useless as far as water extensions are concerned.

If neither one of these two propositions receive the required sixty percent vote, then Birmingham will face another water shortage next summer.

So, Mr. Mrs. and Miss Birmingham, consider the matter carefully, make your individual decision—then be sure that nothing keeps you from casting your vote next Wednesday.
