TO ISSUE BONDS FOR \$39,000 FOR WATER SYSTEM

Shall the Village of Birmingham borrow the sum of \$39,000.00 and issue bonds of the Village therefor for extending the present waterworks system by adding thereto, one new unit consisting of a new well equipped with motor driven centrifugal pump with electric control, operated from the present waterworks together with pump house, relief valve, siren signal, and connections to water mains, and water main extensions with meters for mains, and land for wells.

TO BORROW \$2,400

Shall the Village of Birmingham borrow the sum of \$2,400.00 for installing 1,000 feet of 8 inch cast iron force main in Ann Street to serve as an outlet for the Lincoln Lift and Force Pump.

This is a sewer extension.

TO TRANSFER FUNDS AND TO PURCHASE SEWAGE DISPOSAL SITE

It is proposed to authorize the transfer of funds from the Baldwin Avenue Lift and Force Pump Fund and from the Frank Street Trunk Sewer Fund and to use this money to purchase a site for a sewage disposal plant.

The site proposed is located at the south end of the Morningside Park Subdivision outside the Village limits, and consists of seven and one-half acres. It is proposed to pay \$10,000 for this land.

The Baldwin Avenue Lift will not be needed if this sewage disposal site is purchased, and there is a surplus in the Frank Street fund as it cost less than estimated to complete the work.

TO ISSUE BONDS FOR \$115,000 FOR WATER SYSTEM

Shall the electors of the Village of Birmingham adopt or reject Ordinance No. 95, entitled An Ordinance to authorize the issue of bonds to the amount of One Hundred fifteen thousand dollars (\$115,000) for the purpose of constructing a waterworks system for the Village of Birmingham; the waterworks system to be constructed in accordance with the following specifications and estimate:
