EVERYTHING CARRIES AT ANNUAL SCHOOL MEETING (Continued from page 1)

Mr. Quorton had received a total of 87 votes, Walter Pratt, 16; Frank Schland, 4, and Arthur C. Feck, 13. Mr. Quorton having the majority all the votes cast, was declared elected to succeed Mr. McBride for three years.

Other Matters Will A good deal of discussion took place when the question came up relative to the employment of a school nurse for the ensuing year. Mrs. Charles Wilcox of Pierces street, secretary of the Oakland County Chapter of the Red Cross, gave a talk on the value of a school nurse. The first district, Mrs. Dorothy McMillan, former nurse here, stated that the people vote to hire a nurse to take her place. H. P. Doying of Merrill street, made the motion that a nurse be engaged, and his motion carried.

A goodly portion of humor was made manifest during a discussion concerning the raising of the annual salary of each school board member from \$200 to \$250 per year. Following speeches by W. J. Keineke, Louis Rousseau, John Hanna and several others, it was settled that the latter sum prevail.

Two ballots were taken on the proposition of acquiring a parcel of land adjoining Barham field. The first motion, to pay a sum not to exceed \$7,000 for the site, lost. Another motion was made in which the school board was authorized to start condemnation proceedings in order to acquire the site, and won by a vote of 67-14. A sum of \$6,000 received for the sale of lots given to the school district by the will of Marshall Baldwin, will be used to pay for the condemnation proceedings, it was said.

The proposition to lease three lots in the Maplecrest subdivision for five years at one dollar per year carried. Upon this land will be erected the one-room temporary building.

\$20,000 Issue Carries Shortly after 11 o'clock Monday night, a count of the ballots on the proposition of bonding the district for \$20,000 to be used in completing the Adams grade school and to build the one-room structure showed that a total of 159 votes cast, 87 were favorable, 62 against, and one ballot spoiled. Inasmuch as this needed but a majority of votes to win, it carried.

New Board Meets Directly following adjournment of the meeting Monday night the new school board held a special meeting, and elected H. B. Clement to act as president; R. J. Taylor, secretary; Fred Quorton, treasurer; Leida Lynch and R. J. Corryell, trustees. It was also decided by them to meet regularly twice each month and to meet between times as necessary.

At an early meeting of the board a budget for the ensuing school year will be made, and upon this budget will be determined the rate of school tax to be collected next winter, it was said.
