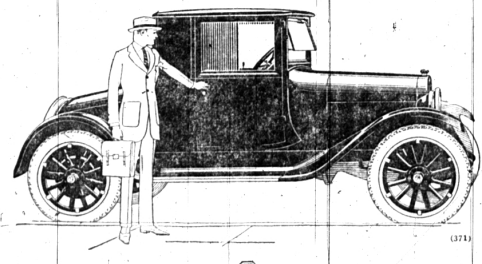

Resolved that the ordinance heretofore adopted be amended so that the following ordinance be adopted: Ordinance No. 99, Year, 2, May, 6.

and Hanna St. It is further resolved that all the lots and parcels of land fronting and abutting on each side of said Hanna St. above described will be benefited by said improvement and shall constitute a special assessment district upon which a special assessment shall be levied to defray a portion of the expense of constructing said sewer, manholes, and house connections.

It is further resolved that the Village of Birmingham shall bear 1/4 of the cost of that portion of said lateral sanitary sewer and that the lot and parcels of land embraced in said special assessment district shall bear a certain 3/4 of the cost of the said lateral sanitary sewer and the full cost of the manholes and all improvements according to the benefits derived therefrom and that the special assessments shall be divided into five installments.

It is further resolved that the Village Manager shall cause to be prepared and submitted to this Commission for its approval a map and diagram of said lands and premises

constituting said special assessment district, showing the boundaries and division of all lands and premises thereof, the precise site and location of the sewer that the same with its proposed depth, grade, dimensions and all details together with estimate of the cost and expense of construction of the same and manholes and house connections and appurtenances.
