PRESS PICKINGS
The city of Royal Oak celebrated on Tuesday, June 6, the one hundred anniversary of its founding by a pageant depicting various periods of the century and outstanding events from the time of General Cass stopped under one of its "royal oaks" and gave the settlement its name.

Ford dealers in the United States have asked for a total of 7,750 Ford cars, trucks and tractors to meet their June requirements, says a statement issued by the Ford Motor Company, Detroit, Michigan.
