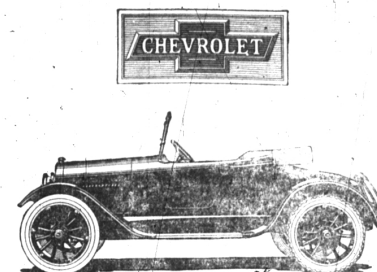
Weddings
