FOR REGISTER JOB**
Seeks Life in August Primary; Long Experience in Law Offices In County

HAS HOST OF FRIENDS

Much comment has been expressed in the County in favor of Miss Lucille Avery, prominent in her position as the office of register of deeds. She is a candidate on the Republican ticket in the August primary.

She is the daughter of the late Dr. Aaron B. Avery and Mrs. Lillian Avery, prominent as a county historian and secretary of the Oakland County Pioneer and Historical Society. She was born in Farmington, Mich., April 11, 1883, and has spent her entire life here. She graduated from the Michigan State Normal College in 1902. Her present position as register of deeds was assumed in the year 1922.

She returned to Pontiac and accepted a position with the Pontiac Axle Company and Wheel Motor Car Company. In March of 1925, Miss Avery worked as a stenographer in the offices of Judge A. S. Pennington, with whom she has since remained with the exception of the period she served during the war as a stenographer in the War Department at Washington.

Miss Avery was until the past few weeks, president of the Oakland County League of Women Voters. She is now a member of the Michigan Business and Professional Women's Club and of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

She has extensive law office and in preparation of legal papers and conveyances. I believe particularly well qualified for the work of a register of deeds," commented Miss Avery this week, "I feel that I will be fitted to ably handle the office."

OBITUARY

Margarette Herison
The death of Mrs. Margarette Herison occurred Sunday, May 14, at her home on North Woodward Avenue following an illness of several weeks. Death was caused from old age.

Mrs. Herison was born Dec. 20, 1825, in Ireland. She came to this country with her parents when she was 18 years of age and lived in Maryland. Dec. 24, 1852, she was united in marriage to William Herison. To this union were born five children, five of whom are living today. In 1865 she was left a widow and came to Michigan with her little family, a year ago.

When a small girl in her home town in Ireland, Mrs. Herison was a member of the United Presbyterian Church. When she came to Michigan she joined the United Methodist church, where she has been active for over 50 years.

The life time of Mrs. Herison covers the terms of 23 presidents of the United States, James Monroe being in office at the time of her birth. During the latter years of her life she was afflicted with rheumatism. Mrs. Herison boasted that she had seen America "grow up," as she expressed it, and that she had seen 100 per cent American.

Surviving Mrs. Herison are five children, George, Frank and Nathan, residing at the old home in Maryland, and Mrs. Victor James and William Herison, at Adams' farm. Funeral services were held from the late residence of Mrs. Herison on Adams' farm Tuesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock with burial in Crook's Cemetery, Troy.
