

The Basis of Chiropractic

The normal activity of every organ, of every muscle and of every tissue of the body is dependent on nerve force.

Example: Too much (motor) nerve force supplied to the muscles causes spasms or tetanic contractions.

Now, how do the thirty-one pairs of spinal nerves branching from the spinal cord get out of the back-bone?

The back-bone is made up of twenty-four small movable bones (called vertebrae) fitted on top of the other.

Through falls, jars, slips, strains and sometimes from causes within the body these little bones (vertebrae) are often displaced.

The only place where bones can press on nerves is at the back-bone where the nerves come out through the holes between adjacent vertebrae.

So the Chiropractor goes to the root of the trouble. He adjusts (replaces with his bare hands) the vertebrae which are misplaced, thus removing the pressure from the nerve.

CAUSE AND EFFECTS

Pains, chills, fever, headaches, vomiting, jaundice, etc., are symptoms. Symptoms are signs—signs that the nerve supply to some part of the body is being interfered with.
