CLEVER TRICKS SOLVE MURDERS

STATE POLICE TRY STRATEGY TO TRAP SUSPECTS IN DIFFICULT CASES.

KILLER OF GIRL CONFESSES

Sudden Question to Woman Who Poisoned Husband and Father-in-Law Causes Her to Admit Facts of Crime.

Sergeant George Karkiet and Trooper Ernest G. Rainey of the Michigan State Police were instrumental in solving a murder mystery in Ontonagon, Mich., which had been puzzling the local authorities for eleven months. It took the two members of the Michigan State Police just 24 hours to pick up a clue, run it down, take their man and get a confession from him.

Early last morning, Frances Paumotu, a 15-year-old girl, left her home one morning to go to school and was never seen again after by any of her relatives or friends. She was last seen at a bus for the nearest school. Some where on the way she disappeared. A few days later her body was discovered in a deserted shallow near an old mine. An autopsy revealed the fact that she had been poisoned, but there was no clue to show how or by whom.

Suspect Located.

When Sergeant Karkiet, Sergeant Palmer and Trooper Rainey had such a great measure of success in unravelling the hidden murder mystery at White Cloud, the Ontonagon authorities appealed to the State Police to see what could be done with the mystery of the Paumotu girl's death. Sergeant Karkiet and Trooper Rainey saw were sent there.

Falls Into Trap.

The man who did not understand or speak English received the pleasant smile and produced the match. "Have a cigarette," Sergeant Karkiet invited, extending his cigarette case.

Woman Confesses.

In the White Cloud case the suspect portrait was continued, and the woman whose husband was the victim was taken through the scene of the crime late at night and the things she thought she saw in her husband's confession. While one of them was being questioned he asked: "Did he tell about the old man too?"

He was a son of Rev. and Mrs. Augustus Marsh, and was educated at the Birmingham high school, being graduated from Alma college with class of 1896. He entered literary work as a short story writer, joined the McMillan company of New York and became editor-in-chief of the company's publications, leaving that position a year ago to become literary adviser for Harper & Bros.

His wife, formerly Miss Helen Church of Ithaca, Mich.; his mother, Mrs. Augustus Marsh of Detroit; three sisters, Mrs. V. M. Sum of Flint, Mrs. A. F. Brush of Detroit, and Miss Alice Marsh of Dayton, O., and three brothers, Theodore W. of Detroit, Stuart A. of Berkeley, Cal., and Harry W. of New York City, survive him.
