## Favorite Recipes

### DELICIOUS SALAD FOR FOUR

(Recipe of Mrs. G. R. Averill, 203 Poppleton street.)

Medium sized head of lettuce  
Blanched almonds  
1 cake Philadelphia cream cheese  
Maraschino cherries  
Mint flavor cherries  
Sweet salad dressing  
Whipping cream

Blanch the almonds by pouring boiling water over them and then slipping the skins off when they are loose. Soften the Philadelphia cream cheese by mixing sweet cream or milk into it with a fork. For each portion, put on a plate one-quarter head of lettuce, one lump of the softened cream cheese, ten or twelve blanched almonds, two red cherries and two mint cherries. Cover with dressing made of three tablespoonfuls of sweet salad dressing mixed with one-quarter pint of cream whipped stiff.

### CHUNK PICKLE

(Recipe of Mrs. W. V. Vambull, 404 Ridgeland avenue.)

9 lbs. whole pickles  
1 teaspoon alum  
2 cups vinegar  
3 pints water  
1 oz. celery seed  
1 oz. cinnamon buds  
1 oz. whole allspice  
3 lbs. brown sugar

Wash 9 lbs. salt whole pickles, put them in a brine that will hold up an egg, and leave them for three days. Then soak them for three days in fresh water, changing water each day. Then cut in chunks and put in a kettle with one teaspoon alum and three leaves. Let them simmer for three hours, then drain and make a syrup of three pints of vinegar, one ounce of celery seed, one ounce of cinnamon buds (which may be bought at a drug store), one ounce of whole allspice and three pounds of brown sugar. Put the pickles in a crock, cover them with the syrup and leave them for twenty-four hours. Then heat them again to scalding, but do not boil, and can them hot in pint cans.

### CLIFFTOP TEA COOKIES

(Recipe of Mrs. T. T. Irving, 417 Greenwood avenue.)

1 cup butter  
2 cups brown sugar  
2 eggs  
1 teaspoon soda  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 cup chopped nuts  
3 1/2 cups flour

Cream the butter and sugar together and then add the unbeaten eggs and the dry ingredients alternately. Pack in an oblong mold such as a bread pan and leave in the refrigerator for twenty-four hours. Slice thin and bake about ten minutes in a rather hot oven. This recipe will make five dozen delicious cookies.

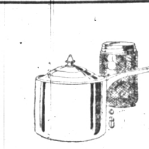

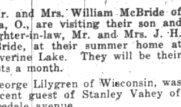
