CHOCOLATE NUGET CAKE
(By Mrs. L. W. Mix, 201 Brown Street.)
1 Cup dark Brown Sugar.
1/2 Cup butter.
2 Egg yolks.
1 Cup sweet milk.
1 Scant tsp. soda.
2 Cups flour.
2 Tsp. baking powder.
1/2 Tsp. salt.
Cream sugar, butter and egg yolks. Sift in dry ingredients.
1/2 Cup dark brown sugar.
1 Cake sweet or 2 squares bitter chocolate.
1/2 Cup milk.
Cook to a custard and add to the first mixture vanilla and whites of eggs well beaten. Bake in moderate oven.

SPECIAL SUGAR COOKIES
(By Mrs. H. A. Poppleton, East Maple avenue.)
2 Eggs.
2 Cups granulated sugar.
1 Cup of butter.
2 Tsp. Sour milk.
1/2 Tsp. soda (stirred in sour milk).
1/2 Tsp. baking powder.
1/2 Tsp. lemon extract.
Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs well beaten. Stir in sour milk and soda. Add baking powder and flour enough for right consistency to roll out. Sprinkle the cookies with granulated sugar and bake in hot oven.

PUMPKIN PIE
(By Mrs. Robert K. McClellan, 124 Harmon avenue.)
1 1/2 Cups stewed pumpkin.
1/4 Cup milk.
1 Cup (heaping) sugar.
1 Tbsp. cornstarch (in milk).
1 Egg.
1 Tbsp. molasses.
1 Tsp. level full, nutmeg.
1 Tsp. level full, cloves.
1 Tsp. level full, ginger.
1 Tsp. level full, cinnamon.
1 1/2 Tsp. cinnamon.
1 1/2 Tsp. melted butter.
1/4 Tsp. salt.
Bake in a moderate oven. Serve with whipped cream.
