APPLE GROWERS SHOULD SPRAY TWICE THIS YEAR, SAYS M.A.C.
Spraying for the second brood of codling moth should be completed in Oakland county by the 20th of July, according to Prof. R. H. Pettit of the Entomology Department of M. A. C.
Prof. Pettit also says that the commercial grower of apples should put two sprays on this year instead of trusting to one. One should be put on this week, and the other the second week in August. The reason for this being that owing to the mixed weather the first generation did not come out in a "wave," but in a long swell which has extended over about five or six weeks of time.
