### Annual Village Taxes Due July 1

Although a number of local citizens have already paid their annual Village taxes, the official date of the beginning of collection is July 1, according to the village treasurer, Village Treasurer, in an announcement made this week.

The amount of taxes levied for the year ending September 30, 1934, is approximately \$75,000.00 and was levied for the same purpose. During the month of July there is no penalty of interest charge on all taxes paid.

"However, beginning August 1, a penalty of one per cent will be added to all unpaid taxes collected during August; from September 1 to October 31 a four per cent penalty will be charged. After November 1 the Village Treasurer will collect at 10 per cent interest on all unpaid taxes."
