BALDWIN BEACON ROYAL OAK WINS FROM BIRMINGHAM NINE, 8-4 In a loosely played game last Friday the Royal Oak nine defeated Birmingham 8 to 4. Birmingham counted three runs in the first inning and were then held scoreless until the eighth, when another run was scored. They were credited with as many hits and had more men on bases than the visitors, but were unable to bunch them. Bill Drake started on the mound for Birmingham, but could not find the plate. Two other pitchers were used, "Lefty" Schorr starting the fifth, and continuing until the eighth, when he was replaced by Wilson. Royal Oak's victory was largely due to the three hitting of Kenagy, who hit two heavy hitters, with men on bases both times. Peek, Royal Oak's pitcher, was effective at times. He has a fine fast ball that will trouble most high school teams, and also is good at mixing up the curves. Birmingham plays a return game with Royal Oak later in the season. They are sure they will get back at the Oakers in this game.
