back, of the Standard Oil Company, and a newspaper representative, who acted as official observers.

The Portland report states that the run was the most successful ever held in that section of the country. The car used was a demonstrator which had not been driven more than 750 miles, and no special equipment of any kind was used. Beyond turning up the motor, no change at all was made in the car.

The top and windshield were up, and the load of three men of about average weight approximated the usual load carried by the ordinary driver. Road conditions were taken as they came, and no special effort was made to spare the car. In fact on the return trip it rained heavily for about twenty miles of the way, preventing even the ordinary amount of coasting on the grades.

Village Tax Time Extended To Wednesday, Nov. 14

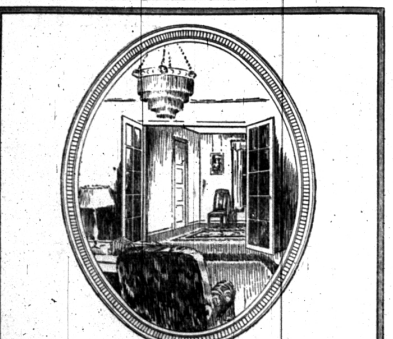
BY Special Arrangement with the County Treasurer, I have obtained an extension of two weeks to enable Birmingham property owners to pay their 1923 Village tax at my office.

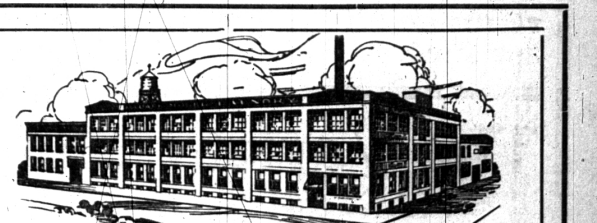
