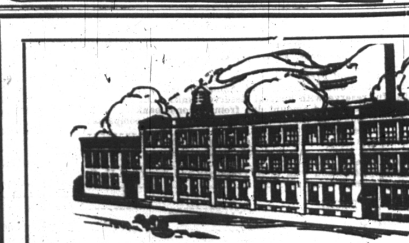

Section 23. No person shall hitch up or attempt to hitch to any moving vehicle either with or without the permission of the operator thereof.

Section 24. Every motor vehicle standing upon any street, except taxis, lighted by headlamp lights, shall be provided at night time with one rear lighted lamp, which shall display a red light.

Section 25. Whenever there is not sufficient light upon the roadway to make all vehicles, persons or obstacles travel clearly visible for a distance of at least 100 feet ahead, the front light which a motor vehicle is required to display, shall when the vehicle is in motion, throw the light straight ahead of such motor vehicle for a distance of at least 100 feet.

Section 26. No person shall adjust or attempt to adjust so that no dazzling rays from it or any reflector shall at any time be more than 3 1/2 feet from the ground on a level road at a distance of 75 feet or more ahead of any motor vehicle.

Section 27. All motor trucks, omnibuses and all other commercial vehicles of one and one-half ton capacity or more, equipped with a motor or other reflecting device so adjusted that the operator of said motor truck or omnibus shall have clear and full view of the street and conditions of traffic in the rear of such motor vehicle.

Section 28. No person or operator of any vehicle shall extend beyond the maximum width of such vehicle any load which exceeds 4 feet in width over all including load over all including load or more than 10 feet in length, which such load shall be so secured to the motor propelled vehicle and one end of the load shall be so secured to the motor propelled vehicle and the other end of the load shall be so secured to the motor propelled vehicle.

Section 29. There is hereby created an automobile or vehicle pound, to which automobiles or vehicles may be removed by the members of the Police Department in the cases hereinafter provided.

Section 30. Whenever any vehicle shall be removed from the street and placed in the pound, the owner thereof shall be notified by the officer in charge of such pound, the sum of two dollars.

Section 31. Whenever it shall be impracticable for any officer witnessing a violation of any provision of this ordinance to cause the offending vehicle to be removed from the street, he may instead, serve a notice to such vehicle notifying the owner thereof of the estimated total charge of the pound for such vehicle.

Section 32. It shall be the duty of the Police Department to promptly account for and pay all fees collected under this ordinance to the Village Treasurer.

Section 33. Any person or person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not to exceed \$25, or imprisonment in the county jail for not more than 30 days, or both such fine and imprisonment, at the discretion of the court.

Section 34. This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after the date of its passage by the Commission of the Village of Birmingham on the 17th day of September, 1928.
