Auto Club Offers 10 Commandments

- 1. In an effort to aid in the reduction of accidents, the Oakland County Automobile Club has compiled a list of 10 "commandments" regarding car operation.
- 2. The 10 "commandments" are as follows:
1. "Always have your car under control."
2. "Save lives—drive to right of safety whenever your brakes regularly."
3. "Give plain signal before you slow down, stop or turn."
4. "Stop before crossing streets with heavy traffic and car lines."
5. "Do not speed by heavy traffic or drive three abreast."
6. "Stop back of street cars."
7. "Do not drive with glaring headlights or with tail lights out."
8. "Licenses/plates must be kept properly hung."
9. "Use common sense, show courtesy."

1. "Make a thorough inspection of the brakes and their linings every thirty days. Adjust them so that the clearing between the lining and the drum has a clearance of about 1-64 of an inch."

2. "Test the brakes by jacking up one wheel at a time and then shift the car into high gear. Apply the brakes slowly. If they are adjusted properly, the engine will slow down uniformly; if not, they should be adjusted accordingly."

3. "Particulate of steel, grease and dirt may be removed from the brake lining by washing it thoroughly with kerosene, but care should be taken that it is allowed to dry before using the car. Glazed spots can be removed from the lining by roughening with a file. Tighten all the lock nuts and flatten rivets so that they will not protrude through the lining."

4. "After these operations are finished, adjust the brake pedal so that it will not touch the floor boards when it is pressed down, and also adjust the brake lever so that it will never touch the end of the slot in the floor board."

5. "Then use the motor as a brake when driving in the hills. Retarding the spark will slow down the motor and save the brakes. Try the various conditions to which your brakes would be subjected, and see how quickly the car will stop."
