(Little Editorials picked up by the Staff and around Birmingham.)
Mrs. John Camp of Greenwood and Vinewood avenues: "This very cold weather we've been having isn't so bad when you get right out in it, but it certainly does make an awful hole in the coal bin."

Joseph Brooks, Supervisor of Southfield Township: "We are looking for quite a country of Southfield road between the 10th and 14th Mile roads. Detroit parties have bought about 900 acres in there, and are laying out parks, boulevards and circular drives. Restrictions there are very high. We all hope down here in Southfield that the good work will continue."

Ralph Ryder, of the local Standard Oil filling station: "This cold snap we've had knocked off trade about 50%; but these warm days have just brought it back to normal. As a whole, though, the gasoline business this winter is better than it was last, because every year the closed factories become more popular, and more people drive in the winter-time than ever before."

Rev. T. J. Edwards, pastor of the First Baptist church: "It is a very good thing that the business girls in town have that spirit of fellowship in their club, which is much the same as the Rotary and Kiwanis clubs. I think it is especially necessary now that women and girls who are old enough to vote are taking such an active interest in business and political life. More lucrative fields are being opened up by women than women that ever before and many of the community affairs are being actively handled by women. I do, however, believe that some sort of an educational or progressive program should be carried out, although it be only a short paper on some live, current subject."

J. S. Briggs, owner of Quality Grocery: "No, I don't think I would care to run for commissioner of the Village of Birmingham. Anyone with a business of his own cannot conscientiously attend to his own work and do justice to the work which is necessary for a public office-holder. From there is another angle. No one can please even seven-tenths of the public and the remaining three-tenths are knackers. This, of course, affects one's personal business. There are a great many 'big' men in Birmingham and, as a property owner, they ought to take an interest in the Village activities."

George H. Mitchell, retired postmaster: "Around the Supervisor's office a pleasant conversation with Daniel Smith, Town Treasurer is collecting taxes, one hears much about the high rate in Bloomfield Township. But reading the Detroit Evening News last evening we are inclined to think that it is a pleasant surprise carried out by the great Walverine state: In the village the tax rate is \$32.08 per M. and outside in the Township it is \$33.58. Speaking of the tax rate in Charlotte it reads: "The tax rate here is \$32.54 a \$1,000. This is said to be lower than most cities in this part of the state. The rate at Grand Lodge, giving us \$33.33 and Howell at \$48.76. There is one school district in the town of Troy that pays just for the School tax at the rate of \$33.11, and you add this tax to the others and Bloomfield taxes just hide their faces with shame at their own cheapness."
