OBITUARY

Walter H. Bynon
Following an operation for appendicitis in Harper hospital Monday evening of this week, Walter H. Bynon, 47 years old, died Tuesday night of complications following the operation. He was born in Grand Rapids and

had spent the past 20 years in Detroit as city salesman for the A. Stine Manufacturing Co. The family has lived in Birmingham for about six months.
Mr. Bynon was a member of Kilwinning Lodge, No. 297 F. & A. M., Michigan Sovereign Consistory, Masonic Temple and Brooklands Golf Club.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Sarah McLane Bynon, a 9-year-old daughter, Ruth, two sisters and a father, William Bynon, all of Los Angeles, California.
The funeral will be held from the late home on Ridgedale avenue this afternoon with Rev. Dr. O'Dell of Westminster Methodist church, Detroit, officiating. Interment will take place in the family vault at Evergreen cemetery, Detroit.

Albert C. Baldwin
Albert C. Baldwin, born in Birmingham in 1861 and a graduate of the Birmingham public schools, died at his late home in Grand Lodge Thursday, July 10, after an absence from Birmingham of nearly 40 years. For many years after leaving Birmingham Mr. Baldwin was associated in the drug business in Pontiac. He later moved to Grand Lodge and engaged in the grocery and drug business until a few months ago when his health began to fail. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Baldwin, were residents of Birmingham for many years.

Mr. Baldwin was a member of the Grand Lodge Chapter of the Knights of Pythias, the Macabres, the Modern Woodmen and the Chamber of Commerce. The funeral, conducted by the Knights of Pythias, was held July 13 from the late home with burial in Oakwood cemetery at Grand Lodge.
