LINCOLN SALE MAY ESTABLISH NEW HIGH

May sales of six broke all records in the history of the Lincoln Motor Company, a division of the Ford Motor Company.

The steadily increasing popularity of the Lincoln automobile among discriminating buyers of American quality cars never was more strikingly shown than during the past three months in which retail deliveries have continued to climb to new high records. In March the sales set a new mark in greatly exceeding those of any previous month. April sales were in excess of March, while May, with 868 Lincolns delivered to customers, equaled by 100 the high record established in April.

All indications are that June sales will show a decided increase over May.

May was another 200,000 sales month for the Ford Motor Company, making that month one of the highest in the company's history and completing three consecutive months in which domestic car deliveries exceeded the 200,000 figure.

The company announced here today that 292,601 Ford cars and trucks were sold at retail in the United States during May, an increase of 35,000 over the same month a year ago.

The college of architecture was presented with a fellowship of \$1,200 a year ago by George C. Booth of Grand Rapids, Michigan. His first competition was held in April, because the drawings entered by Miss Blood and Mrs. Gower were of equal merit, the judges were forced to divide the award. Ten students competed.

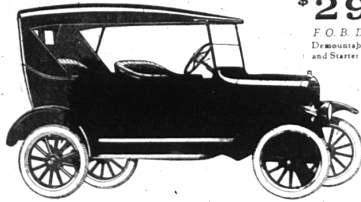

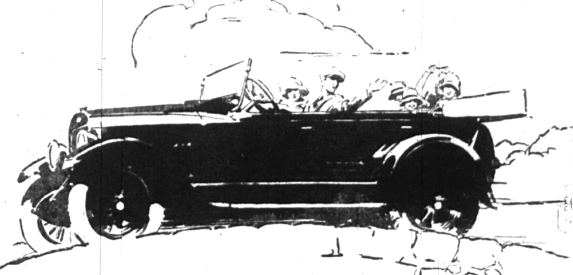
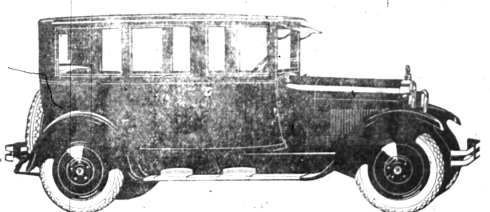
