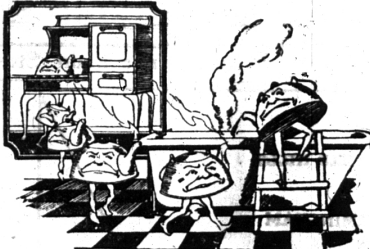

USES TELEPHONE IN DESPATCHING SPEEDS SERVICE

San Antonio Trolley Run Ten Per Cent Faster, Declares Line's Superintendent

The telephone, which is gradually superseding the telegraph as a means of communication between streetcar terminals, is also giving good service in despatching work on some of the passenger lines.

In a recent issue of the Electric Railway Journal, William W. Hill, Superintendent of Transportation of the San Antonio Electric Service Company, tells of the success of the telephone despatching system which has been in operation on this company's lines since 1914.

Telephones are installed at the terminals of all lines and at other points along the way, making it an easy matter to keep in touch with the cars. In case of emergency that may arise, traffic delays, time accidents and other such troubles, the telephone promptly reports the dispatcher.
