State Recommendations Iodized Salt For Goitre Treatment

Lansing, May 8—That simple goiter will become a thing of the past in Michigan when the new iodized table salt comes into general use throughout the state is the prediction of health authorities. The salt, manufactured especially for Michigan use by all of the salt companies in the state, is already on sale in the cities, and wholesale grocers promise that by May 1 it will be in the hands of retail dealers.

"The introduction of iodized table salt is one of the most important events in Michigan's public health history," says Dr. R. M. Olin, Commissioner of Health. "Michigan, like Switzerland, is coming to be internationally known for the prevalence of thyroid enlargement. It is one of our most urgent, and yet simplest public health problems, and we believe that the solution has been found in iodized salt."

The iodized salt looks exactly like ordinary salt, tastes the same, and costs only a trifle more. It differs in just one important particular, it contains 0.2 of one per cent of sodium iodide, the element that is lacking in Michigan's food and water supply. Health authorities emphasize the fact that the salt is a preventive and will not take the place of medical treatment for the diseased thyroid.

Quick thinking and equally quick acting enabled Arthur Warriner to save two lives during the year. Single-handed, he removed a heavy pole that had fallen on Eloy R. Nelson, near Vulcan, Mich., and through his knowledge of first aid, Mr. Nelson was badly injured. Later he saved O. V. Eaton, telephone installer, at the latter was about to be crushed between two freight cars near the Ford body plant at Iron Mountain.
