COMMISSION DECIDES OWNERSHIP OF STREETS AND ROADS

\$15,000 each year, because of the addition of four miles to his route. He demanded that Birmingham allow his trucks to reach Southfield avenue over some east and west Birmingham street. And so he brought Mr. Fagan to Birmingham Monday night. But close questioning of Mr. Fagan brought to light the fact that he does not control that the streets of Birmingham are owned by the Michigan Public Utilities Commission.

"The subject of my interference in this matter is not to usurp the ownership of Birmingham's streets," admitted Mr. Fagan, "but we do feel that the Utilities Commission has a right to assist any company in the matter of the use of Michigan's highways for the transportation of commerce. Governor Greeneback has declared that it is necessary to keep as much vehicular traffic off Woodward avenue as possible, until the widening project is completed."

So Mr. Fagan left the commission chambers Monday night with the assurance that the Smith Trucking Co. may use Lincoln avenue to get to Southfield from Woodward avenue. All that remains for this to be done is the repairing of Lincoln avenue.

Outside of these on each side is to be a 40 ft. pavement, making 174 feet. Outside of these on each side is to be fifteen feet for tree planting, seeding and sidewalks, making 204 feet in all. There appears to be but two ways in which this can be carried out through the village, viz. by following Woodward Avenue where it is or by following the railroad track. The former would require the purchase of all the land needed on the east side of the Avenue the entire length of the village and the removal of all the buildings which would make the cost prohibitive. The latter course would only require the removal of a few comparatively cheap buildings, would provide a wide roadway, digging away with steep banks so that all trucking and through traffic would leave Woodward avenue as it is, and with the car tracks removed it will be an ideal street both for residence and
