PASTEURIZED MILK Vs. RAW MILK

PASTEURIZATION is hereby defined as a process by which milk is heated to a temperature of 142° to 145° Fahrenheit and held at this temperature for a period of not less than thirty minutes, then suddenly cooled to a temperature of 50° or lower and shall be held at or below 50° until delivered to the consumer.

Raw milk is hereby defined as milk that has not been heated in any way to destroy the Coccidia, such as Typhoid Fever, Scarlet Fever, Diphtheria, Dysentery and other germs that exist in milk by the thousands.

Milk that has been properly pasteurized destroys these germs—and makes a healthy, nutritious food for the children as well as the grown-ups.

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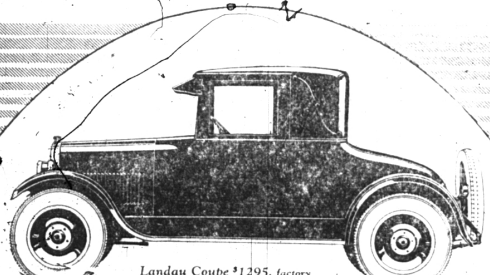
