WE HEARD IT SAID BY—

(Little Editorials picked up by the Staff in and around Birmingham.)

Mrs. Sarah Carter of Townsends at "Passing through the stretch between here and Pontiac, I was given to notice how torn up everything was. This tearing up of the wider Woodward avenue is foolish and wicked. They are making a wider road necessary and needlessly spoiling ground that should be used for crops. I can remember the time when all that property along there was planted to potatoes or corn, or some other worth-while thing to man. In my opinion, no matter how wide it was made, if 500 feet, motorists would insist on running ahead, racing with one another."

Charles G. Walker, of South Woodward avenue: "This new proposed 204 foot Southfield avenue is destined to mean more than can possibly be estimated to property owners out here. I have no idea that the road will be completed for perhaps many years, but the right-of-way obtained is the greatest stride toward such a project, as can be seen in the project of wider Woodward avenue. There is little doubt that the section of the country along Southfield is going to be among the fast growing developments around Detroit and, in my opinion, this decision on the right-of-way shows real foresight on the part of those responsible."

F. S. Buell, Justice of the Peace: "These are very dead days in the local court. I have had here since last March. Last Tuesday I had but 12 cases come before me, though the same day a week before there were 32 cases. That was caused largely, I suppose, by Labor Day; the day before. The speeding cases now are very few as this cold weather takes much of the traffic off Woodward avenue, but it seems that the accidents do not decrease there. However the court had a very active summer and this fall is like a vacation."

Clarence Vliet, Supt. of Schools: "The peace and beauty of the school grounds and yards is a problem when the children are coming and going over it all day. However, we are able to keep the grounds looking clean and neat most of the time. But there is one person in this town who about three times a week, comes along early in the morning with an armful of garbage and tosses it all down neatly in a newspaper, and deposits the bundle in the bushes on the Barnum school grounds. This hasn't happened once, but is a continual affair. With the village beautification for this morning, it does not seem to me that this kind of thing is at all called for."
