I have tried to see as many of the voters as possible during the campaign, which is almost closed, but you will realize it is physically impossible to visit each of the 35,000 to 40,000 registered voters in Oakland County.

I wish each voter would inform themselves as to some of the big things accomplished by the Board of Supervisors of Oakland County during the two years I was its chairman. I will briefly mention a few of them: The completion of the new jail; the remodeling of the old one saving the county from ten to fifteen thousand dollars annually for office rental; the creation of a County Welfare Board, which has made such a splendid showing; the establishment of a farmers or citrus market in the city of Pontiac; the adoption of the budget system, thereby limiting the expenditures of each department of the county; the employing of a county accountant, eliminating the necessity of employing outside accountants at an enormous expense, also making it possible to know the exact condition of each county fund at the close of each day; the creation of a sinking fund of approximately \$50,000, and the authorization of \$190,000 additional, by the voters of Oakland County to provide a home, and hospital, for the indigent and unfortunate of the county.

I set forth at length in my announcements of my candidacy, my qualifications and I wish to again assure the public, if nominated and elected county treasurer, a courteous, efficient, and economical administration of the office. Schnell has been through much in his 35 years of life in Royal Oak township, Michigan.

From the first he has been a sportsman. A hunter, always fair in game hunting. He has been quick at the gun, but never a destroyer of weak animal life. He has stamped out the poewhens and protected the real birds of value.

He was appointed to official life as deputy sheriff January 1, 1921, in the first year of Sheriff Butler's reign. On May 28, same year, he was shot and injured by the Conti gang, one and a half miles west of Commerce, Mich., in pursuit of the Italian bandit gang. He was in the hospital from this fight for three days. Later in the fall he was attacked by two Detroit bandits—Eddie Weisman and Tony Yarnick—returning from Saginaw from officers from whom they had escaped.

Not knowing their identity, Schnell allowed them a ride, and was in turn shot and thrown from his machine by the two bandits he had unknowingly helped. Both Weisman and Yarnick were later captured and are now serving long terms in Marquette and Jackson.

From the wounds received from this last encounter Schnell nearly lost his eye, and his life. He was in the hospital a long time.

Mr. Schnell has never made promises to paid officials or deputies, and has made no promises to any workers.

To the Voters of Oakland County:

It has taken nearly four years of work to plan the trunk line drainage for the southern part of the county in order to give any uniform system of Drainage for Royal Oak, Pleasant Ridge, Ferndale, Clawson, Berkeley, and adjacent territory thereto, including some of Southfield township, southeast part of Bloomfield and the southern part of Troy.

A plan has been worked out hereby it is giving that territory complete drainage. Then there is the southern part of Southfield and Farmington Townships which is being worked out at the present time. All with the idea of taking care of the sewerage as well as the drainage.

We have what is known as the Campbell Road Drain taking care of everything east of Woodward Avenue and west of the John R. District together with the outlet through the Red Run at the cost of nearly \$1,000,000 which is one of the units in the south end of the County.

Then we have the Allen and Hubbard Drains on the west of Woodward Avenue with the tax district nearly made out and some of the Right of Way secured, which takes care of the west side of Woodward Ave. far over as the eastern part of Southfield Township.

Then there is the Lawson Drain starting in at the junction of 12th Mile Rd. and Campbell Rd. at the Red Run, running north and westerly, taking care of Clawson and all property to the east of Birmingham. One part has been let and work has already been started.

In the Farmington District, entering into the Rouge in Wayne County, and the Hazel Drain which takes care of the southeast part of Farmington and southwest part of Southfield which contracts have been let.

At Farmington we have another large drain taking care of property west of Farmington Village which we are working on at the present time.

We have the Pontiac Creek starting in the City of Pontiac, running north and westerly through the City of Pontiac, Pontiac and Waterford Townships, taking in property for drainage nearly to Watkins Lake.

The right of way is being secured for the Patterson & Holly Drain and for the Billy Sunday running south and east of Holly and into the Patterson and Holly Drain.

With about forty other smaller drains which are being worked up at the present time.

I submit to the taxpayers of the county that with all this work successfully under way, it is good business to retain the present commissioner.
