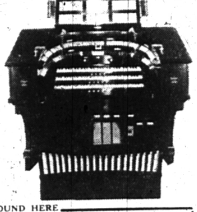

BOARD OF EDUCATION

Birmingham, Mich., March 30, 1925. A special meeting of the Board of Education was held in the office at 8 p.m.

Present: H. B. Clement, R. J. Taylor, Fred V. Quanton, Leigh Lynch, and E. J. Coryell.

Mr. Quanton reported an option for 40 acres from March 20, 1925 had been secured from W. Malcolm McDonald on a piece of land in the northeast corner of the S. W. 26, 26, Twp. of Bloomfield, Range 2 North, 10 East and bounded on the north by Oak St., extended on the east by Chesterfield avenue, on the south by Malcolm McDonald, and on the west by Wm. Beattie, consisting of 7 acres more or less for the sum of \$18,000 payable at once as bonds can be sold after a favorable vote by the legal voters of said School District.

Moved by Taylor, supported by Coryell that 40 day option be secured by Mr. Lynch for School District No. 1, Fr. Bloomfield, Royal Oak and Southfield, on the proposed Adams school playground located as follows: 26, 27, 28, and 29, Poppleton Heights Subdivision in the Village of Birmingham, Bloomfield Township, Range 2 North, 10 East and bounded on the north by Oakland Avenue, on the south by Adams Avenue, on the west by Worth St., and on the east by Taylor Street.

Moved by Taylor supported by Coryell that MA. Madison be directed to proceed with the plans for the enlarged Adams school subject to the approval of a committee composed of R. J. Coryell, Leigh Lynch and Fred V. Quanton at a meeting to be held at 7 p.m., Wednesday, April 1, 1925.

Moved by Coryell supported by Lynch that the salary list for the school year 1925-26 as approved by the board and that returns be made of the respective individuals at the salary named in such salary list being requested not later than April 13, 1925.

Moved and seconded to advance carried.

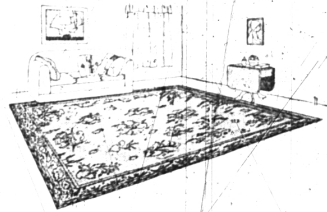
