Two Contracts Let For Laying Out Pavement On Pontiac-Detroit Highway... 3 ROAD-BUILDING CROWS

WOOD PROGRESSING UNDER WOODWARD

With three road-building crews at work between the Eleven-mile road and Pontiac, it is expected that most of the two-way thoroughfare between Pontiac and Detroit will be completed by fall. This does not mean the entire two-way project by any means, but enough to be done so that for the most part north and south traffic will be separated on two distinct strips of pavement.

WOOD PROGRESSING UNDER WOODWARD

The Knapp Construction company, of Monroe, has been awarded the contract for four miles of paving on the west side of the avenue from the Eleven-mile road to Birmingham. This contract calls for only the construction of 22 feet of the 40-foot pavement on the west side.

Chicago, has been given the contract for the construction of the east half of the 40-foot pavement on the east side of Woodward avenue, from Pontiac about four miles south to a point where the highway may have to cross the tracks of the Grand Trunk railroad.

Grading work still is in progress between Pontiac and Birmingham on both sides of the D. U. R. tracks and in the Blossom quarter in the city. There is considerable grading to be done. Until it is definitely decided on the pavement work, there will be no progress on the completion of a pavement on this section of the thoroughfare.
