1,800,000 People Live In Greater Detroit

According to new figures compiled last week, the population of Metropolitan Detroit is shown to be more than 1,800,000, if based upon the new school enumerations and the ratio that is figured by the Federal Bureau of the Census, writes Charles D. Kelley, in last Sunday's Detroit News.

The Federal ratio for Detroit, based upon the school enumeration and census of 1920, is 4.46. In other words, if the present enumeration of that year is multiplied by 4.46 the product is the population for that year.
