26 U. Of M. Football Schedule To Be One Of Best, States Yost

"Michigan's 1926 football schedule is one of the best that we have ever arranged," stated Fielding H. Yost, Wolverine Athletic Director. "The opening game with Oklahoma A. & M. should attract wide interest. They are newcomers to Ferry Field and are coached by the famous 'Johnny' Mautschek, whom this generation recalls as one of the most brilliant players Michigan has ever had. "M. S. C. comes to Ferry Field again October 9. State drew a crowd of several thousand more than they can accommodate at home this year. "Our game with Minnesota had already been scheduled. It was a return game. The date of October 16 was open, having been offered to every Conference university, but for

one reason or another was not accepted. Northwestern did not desire the date as she wished to play in Chicago on that date, as the University of Chicago was slated to play in Philadelphia." Only one other chance to play the Purple was November 20, but Northwestern refused this date. "The game with Minnesota is a Notre Dame game. The double game with Minnesota means that Michigan has one more excellent home game."

Coach Yost also pointed out how the Navy-Michigan game to be played in Baltimore's October 30 will be the most important game in the East that week. Two other big games are on the Wolverine's 1926 card: Illinois at Ann Arbor October 23 and Wisconsin at Ann Arbor November 6.

In commenting on the two-game arrangement with Minnesota, Yost recalled the last time when Michigan played two games with the same team in one year. This was in 1894 when Michigan met Cornell twice, the first game being won 22-0 by Cornell and the second being won 14-4 by Michigan.

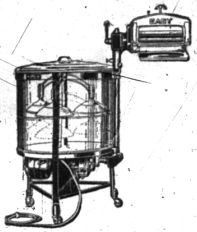
