is a carved block of pinky brown marble. At each end there is a hollowed out a kind of basin, presumably for holding small flowers, and between is a most graceful cluster of thistle that forms the background.

Wonderful Brass Indian workers are very dextrous in their manipulation of brass.

White brass, an alloy is used alone and also with the yellow brass. The white never tarnishes. There are many sizes of bowls all etched and some having the enamel laid on both sides.

Indin earthenware is represented by the Jaipur, a porcelain of dazzling white and clear strong blue in graceful shapes, and the Multani, a kind of peasant pottery with a brown base underlying principally green designs.

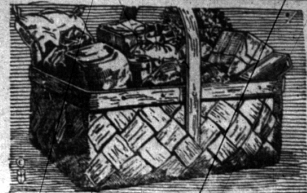
(Little Editorials picked up by the Staff in and around Birmingham.)
