One per cent penalty from August 1 to September 1, 1925, inclusive. Four per cent penalty from September 1 to October 31. 1925, inclusive. No taxes accepted by Village Treasurer after October 31, 1925, as the tax roll will be in the hands of the County Treasurer at Pontiac for collection. All taxes unpaid after October 31, 1925, will bear the four per cent penalty plus three-quarters of one per cent for each additional month or fraction thereof.

How The Credit Bureau Operates

The credit bureau has taken a pating from the account ledger of practically every business and professional man who is a member, which is posted on a card in our files, bearing your name, address and the date and amount of your purchase. Information is added as you pay your accounts, or open new accounts. When you apply for credit, the business or professional man calls the Credit Bureau for your credit rating. The operator in the credit bureau withdraws your card from the files and feports back. Here is a typical report: Mabel Blank, 999 Blank St., is rated prompt pay at la department store for \$40.00. Prompt pay at a millipery store for \$20.00. Prompt pay at a shoe store for \$12.00. In this case Miss Blank would be extended credit because of her past paying nabits were of the best. To sum it up briefly, the manner in which you pay your bills you governs your credit standing of tomorrow.

KEEP YOUR CREDIT GOOD

No matter what your credit standing has been in the past, it is not too late to build up now. Your credit record is revised from day to day. If you have been slow pay in the past, it is very easy to secure a better rating by paying your bills more promptly. If you cannot settle in full, pay part and let your creditor know you are honest and intend to pay. You may have a good rating that will suffer if you become delinquent in meeting your obligations.

THE FOLLOWING TERMS GOVERN YOUR RATING

If you pay your bills as agreed, you are prompt pay If you pay your bills according to the terms of the creditor, you are prompt pay. If you pay your bills in full, every thirty days, you are prompt pay. If you pay your bills in thirty to sixty days, you are slow pay. If you pay your bills in sixty to ninety days, you are slow pay. If you fail to respond to efforts to persuade you to pay, you are poor pay. The Credit Bureau does not endorse or reject you for credit. It is marrely a clearing house for credit information, showing how you have paid your bills in the past.
