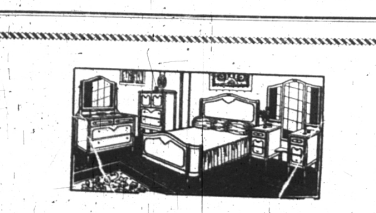

FLAMES DESTROY BARN ON VERNON PATCH FARM

Two fires early this week caused a loss of about \$2,500 and threatened several thousands of dollars worth of property. The greatest loss was on the Vernon Patch farm, three miles east of Adams road, early Monday morning a barn and four horse boxes were completely destroyed. The other fire threatened the home of Dr. H. E. Roberts on West Maple avenue, where a pan of paraffin and turpentine caught fire, causing damage to the amount of about \$50.

It is believed that both barns had dropped a match as the barn was not lit. When the blaze was discovered, at 2:30 the morning by a passing car, the whole interior was ablaze.
