\$200,000 IN HOSPITAL DRIVE NEARLY RAISED

(Continued From Page 1) sinking fund to retire the bonds it would cost an additional \$40,000. Dr. George P. Hayden, district chairman of the campaign, said of the organization luncheon at Tat's Hall last Friday "Birmingham has furnished more than 300 patients for the present Pontiac City hospital during the past year. This amounts to almost 29 of the total number of present admissions to the hospital. With wider Woodward avenue fast becomes a reality, it will phase the new hospital, which will equal any Detroit hospital with its modern facilities, which is different than that. With this realized there will be many more Birmingham people avail themselves of the hospital facilities offered in Pontiac, rather than going to Detroit. Therefore, Birmingham should be correspondingly as active as possible in making the hospital a reality. It will accommodate the entire county. "Birmingham could not hope to build a hospital for her own use within her own boundaries for at least ten years," Dr. A. W. Newitt told the same meeting. "Such a hospital now would be financially possible here as would be in any adequate by comparison that it would be out of the question. There are a large number from this section that require the accommodation of a hospital during the year, but a surprising large number of hospitals, among the even better institutions would be an impossibility and here it is our problem how to assist in bringing this splendidly equipped, modern, and adequate building to Pontiac."
