ARLEN'S "THE GREEN HAT" AT THE GARRICK NEXT WEEK

The world's premiere performance of "The Green Hat," a dramatization by Michael Arlen of his famous novel of the same title, will be given at the Garrick next Sunday night, under the management of A. H. Woods.
