FISHER ENLARGES PLANT FOR OAKLAND'S OUTPUT

Pontiac, Mich., November 19—In order to meet the demand for an year as a companion to the Oakland

increasing number of bodies for the Oakland Motor Car Company and to provide adequate facilities for producing bodies for the new six cylinder car to be introduced early next year.

The present Fisher Body Corporation's \$2,000,000 plant has been devoted exclusively to building Oakland bodies, due to the tremendous demand for the new six cylinder car of the new Oakland and the monthly breaking of sales records since that time. The building additions will add 60,000 more feet of floor space.

This enlargement for body building requirements follows closely the appropriation of three quarters of a million dollars for equipment in the Oakland factories to increase production on the Oakland Six and three million dollars for tools and equipment to build the new six cylinder car which will be produced and distributed by the Oakland organization.

All additions and equipment at the body plant will have been installed before the end of this year.

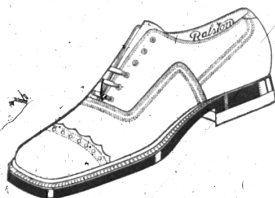

Present: President Shain, Commissioner Shain, Commissioner Dugham.

Minutes of meeting of Nov. 9, 1925, approved as read.

178—Moved by Commissioner Bell that the following bills be allowed: Michigan Leonard Electrical Co., \$1475; Michigan Electric Co., \$23.77; Herbert J. Johnson, \$255.50; Secretary of State, \$235.00; Year, 2 Nays, 0.

179—Moved by President Shain that, it being recommended by the Village Manager Mr. Starr, that the property on West Maple & 1st be sold to the Contingent Fund, referred from that fund to the General Fund, each payment, Year, 2 Nays, 0.

180—Moved by President Shain that \$2,442.95 be paid to the Baldwin Public Library Board, part of amount due them, from taxes, Year, 2 Nays, 0.

181—Moved by Commissioner Bell that Bertling & Dull be allowed \$1,987.32, balance due them on Sewer District, sewer contract, Year, 2 Nays, 0.

182—Moved by President Shain that \$1,000.00 be allowed for Butler Insurance Policy be allowed and policy renewed, Year, 2 Nays, 0.

183—Moved by Commissioner Bell that the bond of the Chicago Bridge & Iron Co. be accepted and bid, and that the other checks be returned to them, Year, 2 Nays, 0.

184—Communications from Board of Education, Department of Health, and the American Road Builders' Association, read and approved, file.

185—Communication from the Standard Oil Co. re Filling Station was read and placed on file, read awaiting report from the zoning Commission.

186—Moved by Commissioner Bell that Benjamin B. Dittell be granted license to conduct automobile at 116 East Maple Ave., Year, 2 Nays, 0.

187—Moved by Commissioner Bell that the President and Clerk be authorized to accept the resignation of Messrs. Messrs., Year, 2 Nays, 0.

188—Moved by President Shain that the following preamble and resolution be adopted:

Whereas, the State Highway Department has proposed that the West line of Woodward Avenue from Oak Street to the intersection of the West line of Woodward Avenue, which proposed line is set forth in the attached map, be vacated;

Therefore, Be It Ordained, That the proposed vacation of the West line of Woodward Avenue, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the South line of Oak Street, 35 ft. West of the present West line of Woodward Avenue; thence in a straight line to a point on the South line of Harmon Avenue, 50 ft. West of the center line of the tracks of the D. U. R.; thence parallel with the tracks of the D. U. R. and 50 feet West of the center line thereof, to a point of intersection with the existing West line of Woodward Avenue, just South of Willis Street; thence along the West line of Woodward Avenue to Maple Avenue.

Be it further Ordained, That the Commission of the Village of Birmingham, through its Highway Department, make the necessary street improvements within 5 years from date.
