N. E. VILLAGE CIVIC ASSOCIATION MAKES KNOWN AIMS, IDEALS

New Local Organization Now Banded Together To Protect People's Property Rights

(Continued from last week.)

8. Expulsion. Any member who shall have been convicted of a felony in any court of competent jurisdiction, or shall have been found guilty of gross immorality, or of conduct derogatory to the good name and standing of this association, shall be subject to expulsion. Any member who has been under suspension for non-payment of dues for a period of one year shall be subject

to expulsion. Such expulsion may be effected by vote of a majority of the Board of Directors. If the expelled member chooses to appeal, the appeal shall be held on the first meeting of the association after the date of such expulsion. The annual meeting of this association shall be held in the month of December in each year hereafter, and such definite time, place and hour as may be designated in the notice thereof, in the Village of Birmingham, Michigan, at which time the voting members shall elect from among their number by written ballot a Board of eight Directors to hold office during the ensuing term of one year from January 1st following and until their successors shall have been elected. Five days notice of the time and place of holding such meetings shall be given in writing to each member in such form as is prescribed by law or by these by-laws.

10. Special Meetings. Special meetings of this association may be held upon three days notice at any time, pursuant to an order of the President, of three members of the Board or upon petition of 25% of the members in good standing. Notices of special meetings of members shall state the purpose or purposes of such meeting and no other business shall at that time be transacted.

11. Quorum of Members. The members present at any regular meeting or special meeting of the members shall constitute a quorum.

12. Proxies. Voting at any meeting of the members may be by proxy. Proxies, to be operative, must be in writing, signed by the principal and filed with the Secretary.

13. Meeting of the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall convene without notice at the date and place of, and immediately following each and every annual meeting of the members, at which time and place the directors shall elect from among their own number a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer, who shall hold their offices for the term of one year and until their successors have been selected and qualified. Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held at such stated times as the board may provide, but not less frequently than once in each quarter of the fiscal year. Meetings of the Board of Directors may be held by giving one day's notice to each director, and no notice shall be necessary as a prerequisite of any meeting of the board at which all directors are present.

14. Quorum of Directors. A majority of the directors, duly convened, shall constitute a quorum.

15. Qualifications of Officers. All officers and directors of this association shall be and remain at all times members of the association. Withdrawal from membership in the association ipso facto vacates the office.

16. Management and By-Laws. The property and lawful business of the association shall be controlled and managed by the Board of Directors, with such power and authority as shall be necessary to complete the execution of the purposes of the association as limited by the by-laws duly made and published. The Board of Directors may, from time to time, make such rules and regulations for their own conduct as they may deem necessary, and such Board of Directors is hereby authorized to enact and amend by-laws not inconsistent with the purposes of this association.

17. President. The President shall preside over all meetings of the directors and all members, shall have and exercise the powers incident to the office of president, and shall perform such other duties as may be delegated to him by the Board of Directors.

18. Vice-President. The Vice-President shall perform all the duties of the president in case of the absence or disqualification of the president.

19. Secretary. The secretary shall be charged with the duty of attending all meetings of the directors and the members, and shall preserve in record books of the association full and correct minutes of the proceedings of all such meetings; shall be the custodian of the association minute books. He shall give all notices required by these by-laws or by resolution of the association, or by the Board of Directors.

20. Treasurer. The treasurer shall keep or cause to be kept, in books belonging to the association, complete and accurate accounts of all receipts and disbursements to and from the association, and shall deposit all monies in the name of and to the credit of the association, in such depository as may be designated by the Board of Directors. He shall disburse the funds of the association in payment of the obligations thereof, taking proper vouchers and receipts for such disbursements. He shall render to the president and directors at the stated meetings of the Board of Directors or whenever they shall require it, and at every annual meeting of the members or at any special meeting called for such purpose, correct statements showing the financial condition of the association. He shall file a bond in the amount of \$500.00, the expense of such bond to be borne by the association, with such surety or sureties as may be approved by the Board.

21. Unions of Officers. Any two offices in this association, except the offices of president and vice-president, may be held by one and the same person.

22. Other Officers and Committees. The Board of Directors shall have power to appoint such other officers or agents as the Board, from time to time, deem necessary, and to fix the terms of such officers and agents, but no such terms shall extend beyond the term of office of said Board.

23. Vacancies. The Board of Directors shall have power to fill any vacancy arising upon said Board or in any office of this association by reason of the resignation, withdrawal or suspension of any member, until the next ensuing annual election, by appointing any member to occupy the position vacated.

24. Removal of Officers or Directors. A majority of the members of the association in good standing shall have power at any regular meeting of the members or at any special meeting legally called, to remove any officer or director for cause and

fill the vacancy, and thereupon the director or officer so removed shall cease to be an officer or director of the association.

25. Salaries. All officers and directors are to serve without salary, but any officer, director, or special agent, duly appointed, may be reimbursed, upon approval of the Board of Directors, for expenses legitimately incurred in the work of this association.

26. Dissolution. This association may be dissolved in such manner as may be approved by the statutes of the State of Michigan. Upon dissolution of this association, the members in good standing shall be entitled to an equal portion of the assets thereof after the payment of all debts and the liquidation of all liabilities of the association.

27. Rules of Order. Robert's Rules of Order is hereby adopted as the parliamentary authority of this association.

28. Amendments. The members, by vote of the majority of those present, may, at any regular meeting or at any special meeting of the members called for such purpose, repeal, alter, or amend the by-laws or any of them. The Board of Directors shall have power to amend these by-laws or enact new by-laws not inconsistent with the purposes of this association.

29. The term of existence of this association is fixed at 30 years from the date of Articles of Association.
