Communication from J. B. Howarth informing the Village that the Detroit Gas Company declines to repay bond for the purchase of gas mains. There was discussion of the fact and the same was referred to the Board of Commissioners.

Whereas Dr. J. E. Mauders has been appointed to the Village of Birmingham by the Board of Birmingham; and whereas the residence of said Dr. Mauders is located in the Village of Birmingham; and whereas it has been against the policy of the Village to give water to anyone outside of the Village;

Therefore, Resolved, that permission be given to Dr. Mauders for use of water from the Village of Birmingham in accordance with contract to be filed entered into from this date to September 7, 1925.

Resolved, hereafter, that before a permit is given to Dr. Mauders, allowing him the use of water from the Village of Birmingham, the County Clerk asking that his property and that of the Village be attached and that he be taken within the Village limits of Birmingham. Yeas, 2; Nays, 0.

Motion of Commissioner Bingham that the same be read and read.

Whereas the 109 C. P. lights at the corner of Willett and Chester streets in the Village of Birmingham, this corner be changed to 699 C. P. Yeas, 2; Nays, 0.

Moved by President Shain that the meeting adjourn. Yeas, 2; Nays, 0.
