### WE HEARD IT SAID BY

(Little Editorials picked up by the Staff in and out of town.)

Frank E. Doty, village attorney, and late captain in the U. S. Army service, with 600 hours of flying credit in his record. In his opinion Colonel Mitchell is correct in demanding a separate air service for this country. The air service should be separated from the Army and Navy departments, because only a practical flyer knows how to fly, and is acquainted with the problems encountered in the air. The only way to defend our country is by having sufficient airships and air men.

Harry E. Starr, village manager: "The reason why many dirt and gravel roads in Birmingham have not been scraped off this fall is because the scraper has been busy on roads that have been torn up for the installation of sanitary sewers. More sanitary sewers were put in this year than usual. However, we hope to take better care of a similar emergency in the future."

Hasel Lawler, city clerk: "Water bills for this quarter were sent out the first of October. The village allows a ten per cent discount when paid before the 15th. Unless they are paid by October 31, the water will be shut off at all delinquent homes."

C. H. Vaxley, of Royal Oak: "I am sending you a dollar and a half for the renewal of my subscription to the Eccentric. Even though we have moved away from Birmingham, we still like to hear about the town and its people, many of whom are our friends."

H. J. Rahl, local builder: "There has been a most notable increase in the number of local homes built for Detroit people. Although still retaining all business connections in the city, they plan to make this their permanent residence. This will continue and aid the Village's plan as a lovely 'Home Town.' While the incoming population increases, there is very little moving away from Birmingham citizens are well pleased with their little community."

A. J. Juris, local real estate agent: "I believe Birmingham's housing capacity is filled to the 100 per cent mark. There is a new apartment house going up and perhaps there will be one or two of these to be rented, but I know of no other vacancy. I have been unable to fill the several applications for houses which I have received in the past few weeks."

Alice M. Clement, student at Western College: "President Boyd of Western College has this year decided that the number of students shall be limited to 500, thus maintaining a helpful contact between students and the faculty. The college is an economic unit and is serving to demonstrate the phases of education in America. In 1911 a fellowship for the creative arts was established and has since that date been held by Dr. Edgar Stillman Kelley, the composer of 'Pilgrim's Progress'."

Joseph Purvis, employe at Mr. Mahafey's filling station: "That article on fox-hunting in last week's Eccentric made me homesick when I read it. I lived only a few miles from Coniston—a very pretty country with many lakes—and I followed the hounds every season."

Mrs. Retta Barr of North Woodward avenue: "The Eccentric has improved much in the last three or four years and has come to fill a real need among the people of Birmingham. When I was in California I looked forward to the arrival of each week's Eccentric with a great deal of pleasure."

H. T. 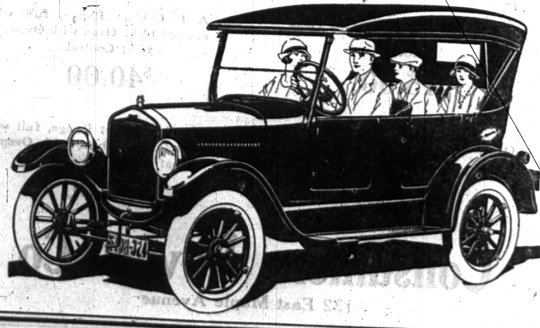
