New York, Oct. 30.—The car of the future, which will be of 100 horsepower and capable of making speeds of 90 miles per hour, will be an American product.

European engineering and manufacturing facilities are not yet in a position to provide the product which the motoring public, particularly in America, is beginning to require, because of the kaleidoscopic traffic conditions.

This is the opinion of Walter P. Chrysler, head of the Chrysler corporation, who returned to this country yesterday aboard the "Berengaria" from an month's visit to England and the continent.

Chrysler, together with J. E. Fields, vice-president in charge of sales, and Fred M. Zeder, vice-president in charge of engineering, attended the nineteenth international Motor exhibition held at the Olympia in London.

They also visited a number of European motor car plants and it is in his investigation of these factories that Chrysler basms his prediction that the new car will be an American development.

"For years we have been accustomed to going to Europe for the finest in motor cars. European engineering and craftsmanship as expressed in their handbuilt cars were considered the very essence of style and quality," said Chrysler on landing.

New ideas in engineering design and coach work were invariably brought over from across the water. But this has all been changed.

Detroit Motor Style Center
"American ingenuity has proved beyond doubt that the design factors of the marvelous precision machinery not only enables us to build greater quantities, but to build greater quantities with even greater accuracy than was possible by the laborious handcraft of European workmen."

"An our Paris distributor recently expressed it to me, 'You come to Paris for style in your cars, we repay the compliment now by going to Detroit for our style in motor cars.'"

"Old traditions of motor car building are fast being discarded. A new way of making things is entering its phase in our industry for the past two years, which has caused us to cast aside many antiquated ideas and methods in automobile designing and building."

One of the most popular-priced field no longer does the old notion hold good that a car to ride comfortably has to be a huge and massive affair. The use of springs and their suspension devices, body lines, more scientific distribution for cars of shorter wheelbase to ride with greater ease and smoothness than cars of much longer wheelbase and more weight, not to mention the advantage of greater facility in handling and parking.

"No longer does a motor have to be a ponderous and clumsy power plant to develop speeds of 70 and 80 miles per hour. New ideas in carburetion and manifold, new discoveries in alloys and other materials enable us to build motors small in size but capable of developing tremendous energy."

"The builders of our better cars have begun to see the trend and are beginning to apply engineering principles and manufacturing economies which up to the present time have been considered only for the popular-priced field."

Meet Traffic Demands
The result is that within two years we can look forward to cars of the very highest standards being of much shorter wheelbase, but giving greater comfort, greater sustained speeds and pickup to cope with the changing highways and traffic conditions, and produced at 25 per cent less cost than existing types of the greatest efficiency.

It has been the astounding growth of the industry in this country which has made the motor car of these new specifications not only possible but necessary. It is only that America takes the initiative in the development of the motor car that will meet the new conditions.

Chrysler also expressed himself most optimistically over the European export prospects for the coming year. Chrysler cars, he said, had met with decided approval and were ranked among the most popular American cars now being sold throughout England and continental Europe.

The outlook for increased sales, not only in England, but particularly in France, Spain, the Scandinavian countries, Holland, Belgium and Germany is most promising, contract renewals with distributors in those countries being vastly ahead of a year ago.
