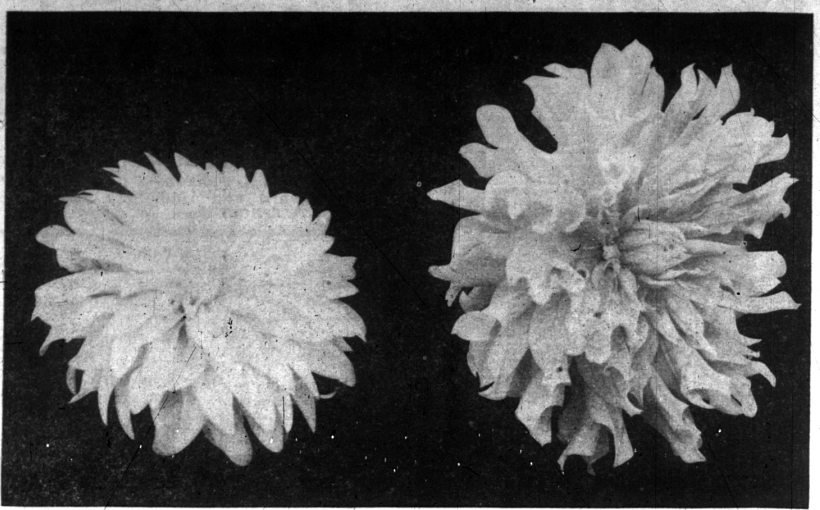

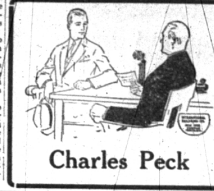

Unsuccessful applicants shall be permitted again to file application for examination at the expiration of three months, but no sooner in case of a firm or corporation, one examination shall be binding to all members of firm or corporation. (c) Any person holding a license who shall allow the name to lapse, shall not be entitled to renew the same without re-examination of said applicant, unless he renews the same within three months from the expiration of the name. No license shall be transferable and the license must be conspicuously posted in the place of business to which it is issued. The Village Clerk shall not be entitled to accept any fee for said license as herein provided, until the said applicant shall present and show to the said Clerk either his license which has expired, or the certificate from the Board of Examiners, that he has passed the examination successfully as above provided. In case any person properly applying to the Village Clerk shall make the proper showing that he is actively bonded with any firm or corporation engaged in the plumbing business in said village and shall request that said license be issued in the name of said firm or corporation, then in that event, the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to issue said license to said firm or corporation.

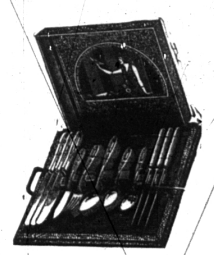
Any change in the location of business or the addition or withdrawal of a member or members of any firm must be reported immediately to the Plumbing Inspector. Provided, that the change in any firm, or corporation by withdrawal or addition of a member or members of said firm already licensed, shall not operate to cancel the application of a new license by the remaining members of said firm, or the new firm so organized, until a new license is issued, provided that the member taking the examination does not withdraw from said firm, in the event that any firm or corporation shall be without a license as herein provided, then the license held by said firm or corporation shall immediately become void. This ordinance shall take immediate effect upon publication of same after adoption by the Commission of the Village of Birmingham.
