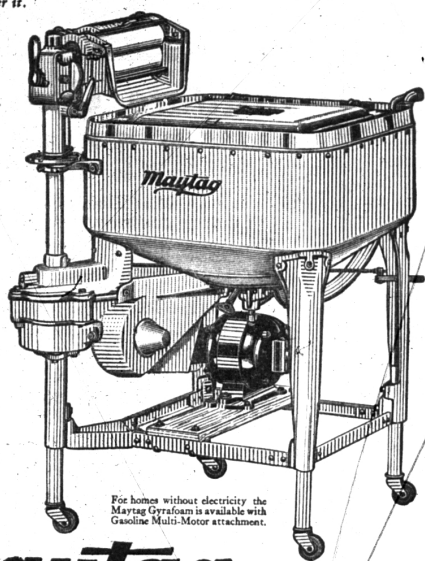

### The Other Chap Says Something

#### THE MIND OF COOLIDGE

A number of our liberal friends are impatient with the Gazette for not getting out and beating Tom-sons against Calvin Coolidge, the conservative leader of the Republican party. Our reason is simple. We are for majority rule. We believe in democracy—which, by the way, does not mean minority rule through the accident of political manipulation. Coolidge, of every test, is entitled to lead his party and to rule this land. It is therefore better to explain him than to quarrel with him. To understand him will help us to use him wisely.

Coolidge's fundamental political policy is a high protective tariff. All right; it all comes back to Vermont. Without a big tariff the owners of many of the little mills of New England would either have to close their doors or cut down their capitalization to comport with the physical value of their plant, and either alternative would disturb the vested right of the mill-worker to his grandfather's job or the right of a stockholder to his grandfather's dividends. The theoretical right of the millions of consumers to commodities at lower prices would not seem a paramount right when opposed by the definite vested rights of labor or of capital. Coolidge thinks, consequently, he takes no chances. His feet are on the ground of a beaten path. He knows his way. He has his faith; he lives up to it. And it has been justified by popular acclaim.

He is obeying a mandate. Coolidge deserves a chance. The people who elected him believe in a limited policy for this government. The liberals of which the Gazette is one, disagree deeply with that policy. But it has received a majority at the polls. The policy should have a fair deal while it is working out. —William Allen White in the Emporia (Kans.) Gazette.
