### WE HEARD IT SAID BY

(Little Editorials picked up by the Staff in and around Birmingham.)

Gay Jensen, of East Maple avenue, believes that one of the most important things needed in Birmingham today is a good Zoning Ordinance. It is to be hoped that a group of men recently appointed by the village commission to prepare such an ordinance make all due haste to complete it. Such an ordinance will set a policy of building construction for Birmingham; it will insure the home owner that his property will always be in a residence section, or at least a planned area to come. Of course, business must eventually expand in Birmingham, but it must do so on a planned basis, not in a hit or miss fashion. A Zoning Ordinance will regulate such conditions.

William McCallum, proprietor of Star Motor Coach Line: "It is my belief that business will never extend—at least during my time—beyond the Grand Trunk railroad on East Maple avenue. Business must go out West Maple avenue, down South Woodward avenue, and also on Pierce street. Within five years property that now brings one thousand dollars a front foot on Woodward avenue will be worth at least three times as much. I think as far as actual property valuation is concerned, Birmingham will soon exceed anything that Pontiac now boasts."

Willis M. Brewer, chairman Oakland County Board of Auditors: "The Eccentric is getting better each week. It certainly sets forth the news of its community better than any weekly paper I am acquainted with. It is clearly constructive. I read it thoroughly each week, even though I live in Pontiac."

Mrs. R. H. Mann of Greenwood avenue: "Parents should concern themselves more directly with the course their children take in going to and from school, where they cross the streets, and how. If every parent would concern himself with instructing his children to cross Maple avenue at the intersection of Maple and Chester streets it would simplify the matter of safeguarding the small children on Maple avenue. Since school closed last year the Woodward traffic has been diverted past the school and the danger triplicated. There is an officer provided this corner to bring the children across from the north side of Maple avenue to the schools safely, but the children appear to use almost every other corner along the street. The school cannot be expected to meet this occasion entirely by placing an officer for the protection of the children but need the cooperation of parents, who should have a genuine interest in this part of their children's curriculum."

Mrs. J. H. Marlott, member of the Community House Board: "Although it is the desire of the community house board to extend the activities of the house and broaden its scope of enterprises, it seems likely that there will be little opportunity of making it serve more purposes this winter than last season. While there seems sufficient open dates now to be had, if the board plans for any activities to fill these dates when life out here is in full swing this winter the house will be overburdened with full dates and no time left for the new things as they arise. Until such time as the board has more space at its command it is doubtful if there will be any great change in the house activities, but it will continue much along the lines of the past."

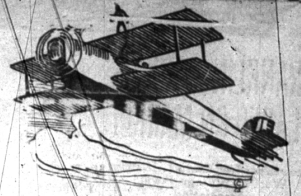

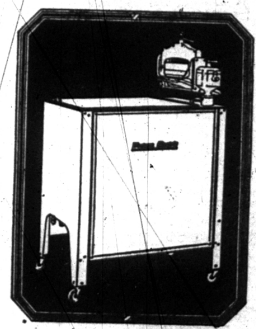
