

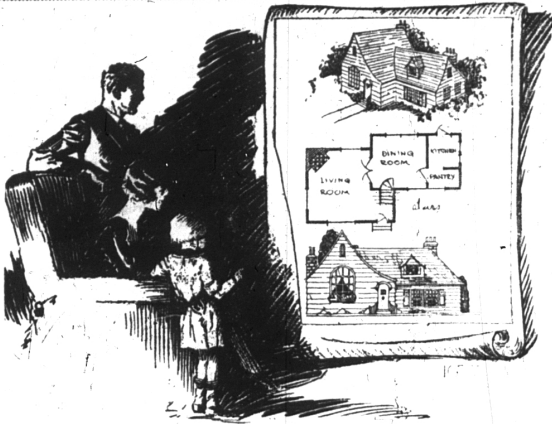

Farm Bureau Banquet At Pontiac April 12

One of the most interesting and enjoyable events in Farm Bureau History in Oakland County was the banquet held last Monday noon at the Central M. E. Church at Pontiac. Men and women from over the entire county were called together to discuss the farmers' problems and the policies which it seems best for the Farm Bureau to adopt in order to meet the situation. The principal speakers for this occasion are nationally known and have served the organization with splendid success in the past.

Lucius Wilson who spoke at the annual meeting of the American Farm Bureau Federation in Chicago last December was the chief speaker. According to reports of those who attended this meeting, Mr. Wilson's talk was by far the most generally appreciated of any given during the conference.

Farm women were interested in the talk by Mrs. Frank Kinch of Grindstone City. She is a pioneer champion of women's rights in the open country and her talks are most interesting and highly amusing.

It was planned to provide a musical treat for the evening through the arrangements with the North Oxford Farmers Club Orchestra. This group of very capable musicians play a varied program calculated to suit every taste in music, and in addition are featuring a fiddler of old time times.

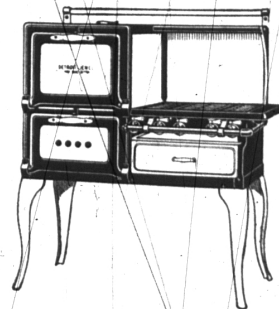
