
# Lands Considered for Annexation



Above is a map of Birmingham and the lands under consideration for annexation, which will be voted on at the annual township election next Monday, April 5. In all, there are over 2,000 acres included in the 14 separate pieces of land; each piece is definitely described on its own

The large shaded portion in the above map, prepared by village manager Harry S. Starr, shows the present boundaries of Birmingham; other portions of the map show the separate pieces that are up for annexation. Each piece, with small lines pointed inward from the outline border, bears a name, either described as a section, part of a section, or some subdivision plat. It is believed that this map should afford the residents of both Birmingham and affected territories a clear understanding of
