CHARLES J. SHAIN, S. O. WYLLIE BELL, DAVY H. LADD, Attorneys Explain The following letter was received by James Campbell of Birmingham from the law firm of Felton & McGee, of Pontiac in answer to a question as to the legality of the election. It explains the issue in detail.

We have examined the affidavit and petitions filed with the Clerk and the affidavits attached to the petitions. We have also examined the provisions of the charter of the village of Birmingham with reference to recall and have concluded that the provisions of the charter do not comply with the requirements of the state law. The home rule act under which the village of Birmingham is organized provides that no provision of any charter or ordinance under that Act shall conflict with or contravene the provisions of any general law of the state, except that village may adopt as a part of its charter any part of the general law of the state relating to the government of villages generally.

After a careful consideration of the matter, we are inclined to say that the fact that the proceedings under the charter do not comply with the requirements of the general recall law of the state, renders the proceedings under the Charter invalid and illegal. However, as stated above, until the
