BOATS NOW USE PONTIAC ENGINES

A decided tribute has been paid the Pontiac Six engine in its conversion to marine use by the Gray Marine Motor company of Detroit. Specially converted Pontiac motors are being sold under the trade name "Gray Six Forty." The engines are sold to the Gray Marine Motor company less manifold, transmission, carburetor, distributor and clutch, as these parts must be replaced by specially designed parts essential to marine usage.

The Pontiac Six engine was selected because it made a particularly efficient power plant for motor boat use. Marine engines must be heavily constructed throughout—capable of running at top speed for long periods of time. Oiling systems must be full force feed bearings, crankshafts and cylinder parts must be of heavy, durable construction so as to withstand the intense heat and terrific vibration encountered in such use. It is because the Pontiac Six engine fulfilled these requirements that it was adopted for marine use.

Chevrolet Plan Used By 40,000 Motorists

More than 40,000 motorists have taken advantage of the Chevrolet six per cent purchase certificate plan since the inauguration of the idea in 1924, according to an announcement today by the Chevrolet Motor company. Wide-spread popularity of the plan is accounted for in the money saving features of the arrangement and that through this means it is easy for anyone to accumulate the down payment on a Chevrolet.

The plan was developed and copyrighted by the Chevrolet Motor company as a result of a survey which showed that the average motorist drives his car three years and pays for it in the first year. It was found that during the entire time the car is being operated the purchaser usually makes no provision whatever for buying his next car.

Through this plan, the Chevrolet Motor company has made it possible for the purchaser to accumulate the down payment on a car without difficulty, to enjoy the advantages of buying for cash and to save six per cent on the money invested in certificates. It also entitles the motorist to pay some of his new car before his old one is turned in, thereby reducing his later payments.

HOHENZOLLERN NAME BRINGS SMALL PRICE

Apparently the transfer from Berlin to Doorn has destroyed the value of a Hohenzollern signature. At a recent auction sale in Germany letters of Schiller and Goethe fetched 330, 450 and 500 marks each. A four-line stanza in the writing of Heine was sold for 1,440 marks. Signatures and letters of Bismark were valued all the way from 0 up to 600 marks, though a letter of General Ludendorff's commanded no more than 10 marks. When a letter of the ex-Kaiser's was put up there was not a single bidder for it at any price. The old guard of Imperialist Junkers insist that the letter was recognized as being so valuable that nobody could afford to offer a fitting price for it. This view, however, was not shared by Republicans.

HOW A FAMOUS PHRASE WAS GIVEN BIRTH, EXPLAINED

Millions for defense but not one cent for tribute! has thrilled many an American youth. The phrase has been attributed to Charles C. Pinckney of the celebrated Federalist family of South Carolina, following a toast offered in his honor. Another version of its origin is given as follows:

Pinckney, with Ellbridge Gerry and John Marshall, had been sent by President John Adams to Paris in October, 1797, to treat with the wily Talleyrand and the Directory over French depositions on American trade. When the commissioners attempted to obtain an interview with the Minister three agents declared that he probably would receive them for \$250,000. This caused Pinckney to exclaim: "No, not a sapience!"

At a later date a banquet was given in Philadelphia in honor of Marshall. Pinckney was invited, but could not be present, whereupon the toastmaster offered a toast in his behalf with the words: "Millions for defense but not one cent for tribute!" This made a better impression than the words Pinckney actually used, and when he died they were inscribed on his tomb in Charleston, S. C.
