**DETROIT**—Close supervision of Detroit cabarets and compulsory closing not later than 3 a. m. will be provided in a new ordinance to be drawn up this week by Nathaniel H. Goldstick, assistant corporation counsel, it was announced.

**HAZEL PARK**—Consolidation of the municipalities of Royal Oak Township is enough of an issue here for the residents to fight about it. Two officers of the Hazel Park Annexation association, an organization which put forth considerable effort about a month ago to obtain a favorable vote on the matter of annexation to Detroit, came to blows about it at a meeting at Lacy school Saturday night.

**DETROIT**—Howard Hummel, 25, of Roe Hotel, who is serving 90-day sentence for driving a drunk, will face a charge of violating his probation in connection with a negligent homicide accusation, and a charge of speeding, the moment he completes his sentence, it was learned.

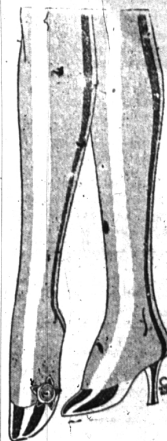

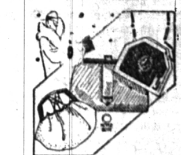
